

## HRH The Princess Royal presents Teledyne Defence & Space with Queen's Award for Innovation

Teledyne Defence & Space (TDS), a business unit of Teledyne UK Limited, has received royal approval with HRH The Princess Royal paying a visit.

The Princess Royal visited Teledyne Defence & Space (TDS), in Shipley on Friday **21 January 2022** to pay recognition to the firm's impact as a business in West Yorkshire and to present The Queen's Award for Innovation.

The Queens' Award for Innovation was originally won by TDS in 2020 but due the challenges of the pandemic, the official presentation has been on hold.

The Princess Royal concluded her time at Teledyne with the unveiling of a plaque to commemorate the visit.
